CONSENT MOTION

The Consent Motion consists of actions not considered to be controversial, nor likely to require explanation or discussion. They will be voted on as one motion made by the Stated Clerk. Members and Commissioners may request the removal of any item from the Consent Motion by contacting the Stated Clerk prior to the meeting or so requesting when the Motion is made. Removed items will be considered at the report time of the agency presenting the motion. When an item includes an election by the Presbytery, persons wishing to make a nomination from the floor should ask to have the item removed from the Consent Motion.

From the Stated Clerk:

1. THAT the Minutes of the 808th Stated Meeting of Baltimore Presbytery, June 17, 2004, be approved as posted on the Presbytery website (www.baltimorepresbytery.org). A copy is appended to the printed version of this White Book.
2. THAT the Administrative Commission appointed by the Committee on Ministry to install the Rev. Jamie A. Gabler as Pastor of the Hancock Presbyterian Church—consisting of Ministers Lon Dring, Jonathan Oglesbee, and Saranell Hartman; Elders Pat Collins (Maryland), Chair, and Kristie Gregory (Hancock); and Corresponding Members Revs. Tim Hartman and Renata Dennis (Greater Atlanta Presbytery)—be dismissed in that Rev. Gabler answered the constitutional questions in the affirmative and was duly installed by the Commission on July 18, 2004.
3. THAT the Administrative Commission appointed by the Committee on Ministry to install the Rev. Elizabeth McLean as Associate Pastor of Woods Memorial Presbyterian Church—consisting of Ministers Peter Nord, Jon Williams and LeAnn Hodges; Elders Bill Starke (Good Shepherd), Chair, Mary Gail Kokish (Christ Our Anchor), Howard Jackson (New Imani) and Nicole Campbell (Prince of Peace); and Corresponding Members Revs. Terry Schoener and Nancy Lincoln-Reynolds, and Nancy Saarlus (Woods Memorial)—be dismissed in that Rev. McLean answered the constitutional questions in the affirmative and was duly installed by the Commission on July 25, 2004.
4. THAT the Administrative Commission appointed by the Committee on Ministry to install the Rev. Iris Tucker-Lloyd as Pastor of the Knox Presbyterian Church—consisting of Ministers Karen Brown and Tim Stern; Elders Bill Starke (Good Shepherd), Chair, Nancy Bennett (Trinity) and Mildred Kreider (Deer Creek Harmony); and Corresponding Members Elders Harold Bennett (Trinity) and Quinton Cates (Knox)—be dismissed in that Rev. Tucker-Lloyd answered the constitutional questions in the affirmative and was duly installed by the Commission on August 29, 2004.
5. THAT the Administrative Commission appointed by the Committee on Ministry to install the Rev. David D. Wilson as Pastor of the Grove Presbyterian Church—consisting of Ministers Tim Stern (Chair), Ken Ironside and Chang Ho Kim; and Elders David Shetterly (Grove) and Barbara Tatum (Trinity)—be dismissed in that Rev. Wilson answered the constitutional questions in the affirmative and was duly installed by the Commission on September 12, 2004.
6. THAT the Rev. Nancy Clark, member of National Capital Presbytery, be enrolled as a Continuing Corresponding Member during her tenure as Interim Associate Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Howard County.

From the Committee on Ministry:

7. THAT the Presbytery appoint the Rev. John Janka of The United Methodist Church as Stated Supply of the First Presbyterian Church of Howard County, effective September 7, 2004, and that he be enrolled as a Continuing Corresponding Member during his tenure in that position.
8. THAT the Rev. Fred Lyons be transferred to National Capital Presbytery, effective September 23, 2004, at his and their request.
9. THAT the Presbytery request the transfer of the Rev. Donald Bracken, Honorably Retired, from Carlisle Presbytery, at his request.
10. THAT the Rev. James Riddell be Honorably Retired on September 30, 2004. [His service in the ministry will be recognized at a subsequent meeting.]

From the Property and Loan Commission

11. THAT the Presbytery approve and guarantee a General Assembly Loan to the Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church in an amount not to exceed \$100,000, to pay for urgently needed repairs to the furnace and roof of the church. The Trustees have been asked to provide a bridge loan so that repairs can be completed before this winter. They have asked the Property and Loan Commission to consult with the church regarding several aspects of the project before bridge funding is made available.

From the Board of Trustees

12. THAT on recommendation of the Board of Trustees (who were directed by the Presbytery to make a recommendation regarding the property of Southminster Presbyterian Church and who have been advised by the Council that all parties are in agreement), the Presbytery direct that the real property of the Southminster Presbyterian Church be transferred to the First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland to support ministry in the local community of Southminster Church. Such transfer will be subject to the proviso that when the property so transferred may be sold the proceeds of such sale, less funds expended by First Presbyterian Church of Cumberland for the improvement and maintenance of the buildings, shall be devoted to mission projects in Western Maryland.

C. General Assembly

- (1) The Commissioners to the General Assembly have chosen to make a written report, which is appended to this White Book and available on the Presbytery Website along with other papers for this meeting. In the near future they will bring a recommendation to the Presbytery coming from their reflections on the interim report of the Theological Task Force on the Peace, Unity and Purity of the Church
- (2) Elder Val Tocci, Commissioner to the 2004 General Assembly became ill during the Assembly in Richmond, Virginia, and was replaced by the elected Alternate, Elder Ed Blanton.
- (3) The Stated Clerk of the General Assembly has advised the Presbytery that it took the following actions on Overtures received from this Presbytery:
 - (a) Overture 04-4 (Item 05-06) to Strike G-6.0106b from the Constitution—GA called upon the church to pray for the Theological Task Force on the Peace, Unity and Purity of the Church.

- (b) Overture 04-08 (14-08) to study the BOP Medical Plan–Disapproved with comment that the review would be done by the GA Committee to Review the Board of Pensions.
- (c) Overture 04-17 (04-10) to provide for administrative leave in case of clergy child abuse–Approved an amended, but substantially the same, version.
- (d) Overture 04-39 (13-01) to grant membership in WHO to Taiwan and related issues–Approved an alternate that did not call for WHO membership for Taiwan.
- (e) Overture 04-65 (12-04) urging peace in Colombia–Approved a similar and stronger resolution.
- (f) Overture 04-66 (11-04) calling for Emergency Contraception to be available on an over-the-counter basis–Disapproved.

D. Judicial and Administrative Matters

- (1) The Rev. Richard Jones renounced the jurisdiction of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in a letter to the Stated Clerk dated June 18, 2004, and was removed from the roll of the Presbytery effective that date in accordance with G-6.0501.
- (2) A Statement of Allegations (D-10.0102b) has been received. The Executive Committee acted on behalf of the Presbytery on July 13, 2004, to appoint the following Investigating Committee: Bruce Barstow, Sue Lowcock Harris, John Kinnier (Govans), Ann Mathews (Maryland), and John Myhill.

E. Report of the Administrative Commission established March 25, 2004

- (1) At its July 15-16, 2004, meeting the Synod rescinded its action of March 27, 2004, to undertake an Administrative Review of Baltimore Presbytery.
- (2) As a result of that action the Stated Clerk advised the General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission that the remedial case brought by Baltimore Presbytery against the Synod action of March 27, 2004, was now moot.
- (3) At its July 15-16, 2004, meeting the Synod took these further actions:
 - (a) Formed a new Administrative Review Commission (G.9.0502) to work with the Presbytery of Baltimore. It has been brought to the attention of the Synod that a continuing member of the presbytery, the Reverend Donald Stroud who serves as a validated minister (G-11.0403 and G-11.0408), is alleged to have declared that he will not abide by G-6.0106b of the Constitution of the PC (USA).
 - (b) The new ARC shall review the policies, procedures and actions of Baltimore Presbytery in regard to its validation (and revalidation) of Mr. Stroud's ministry to ascertain whether said minister has indeed declared to the Presbytery of membership that he will not abide by the above mentioned part of the PC(USA) Constitution; and whether or not the validation of this minister's work by the Presbytery of Baltimore, in its policies and practice, is appropriate or irregular under the Constitution of the PC (USA).
 - (c) The new ARC is directed by Synod Assembly to determine, either from the records of those proceedings vis-à-vis the validation of Mr. Stroud's ministry by Baltimore Presbytery, or from any other documentation as may come to its attention whether, in the items listed above:
 - a. The proceedings have been correctly recorded;
 - b. The proceedings have been regular and in accordance with the Constitution;
 - c. The proceedings have been prudent and equitable;
 - d. The proceedings have been faithful to the mission of the whole church;
 - e. The lawful injunctions of a higher governing body have been obeyed (G-9.409).
 - (d) The powers granted to this Special Administrative Review Commission shall be as follows:
 - a. To inquire into, by means of official records, minutes, the interviewing of witnesses including but not limited to elected officers and staff (past and present) of the Presbytery of Baltimore, members of presbytery, past and present Committee on Ministry leaders and members, validation task force members and leaders (past and present) and all

others such as may have pertinent information and/or knowledge of the matters under review;

b. To request, receive and review copies of all documents, letters, memorandums, minutes, e-mails, etc., which mention the Reverend Donald Stroud, his ministry and/or the validation process and procedures used by the Presbytery of Baltimore with Mr. Stroud, or its manner and method of inquiry and decision-making regarding the validation or revalidation process.

c. To make recommendations to the Presbytery of Baltimore and/or the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic as appropriate based on an in-depth review of whether or not Mr. Stroud may be in defiance of the Constitution of the PC (USA) and his ordination vows, and whether or not the validation of his ministry by the Presbytery of Baltimore has been (or is) irregular vis-à-vis the Book of Order of the PC (USA); and

d. To conclude its work and report fully to the 218th Stated Meeting of the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic meeting July 12-14, 2006 at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Wilmington, DE.

(4) The Commission will present a final report and recommendations at the Presbytery meeting.

15. THAT the Docket be approved as printed and as it may be changed by an announcement from the Moderator or Stated Clerk prior to adoption.
16. THAT the Consent Motion be adopted.

Nancy Clark be their Interim Associate Pastor. During her tenure she will remain a member of National Capital Presbytery, which concurs.

- B. The Session of Hagerstown Presbyterian Church has contracted with the Rev. Robert Ferguson to be their Temporary Supply effective August 15, 2004.

- C. The cost of living increase for 2005 has been calculated at 3.85%. The compensation plan, based on the Presbytery factoring system, will be increased by the 3.85%. The increase is therefore mandatory for any pastor currently paid at the minimum for that pastor's factor.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Ernest L. Poland, Jr.
September 23, 2004

I believe the Triune God to be the Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer of all of humanity. This single God created the whole of the universe, and reigns in judgment over creation for all time to come. This God alone is worthy of our worship. God provides a way for us to seek God, through the peace of Jesus Christ and the communion of the Holy Spirit.

I believe that God has complete sovereignty over all of creation. God created all things, seen and unseen. God allows for sin through the exercise of our own free will, and we would not continue to sin if God exercised such a command. We can do nothing that is not permitted by God. We are born into sin through the transgression of our first parents, but we retain the responsibility to choose the path of righteousness and goodness. Through God's grace, we may freely seek God's love through the redemptive power of Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

I believe that Jesus Christ was sent to die upon a cross for the sins of all humankind. I believe that Jesus willingly yet reluctantly accepted this task. Jesus is truly God and truly human, and this assumption of two natures was necessary for God's reconciling act to be complete. This resurrected Christ lives and knocks at the door of our hearts to gain entrance. Christ broke the bonds of death in order

that we may live with him in heaven forever. Through this sacrifice, we are invited to share in God's eternal glory.

The Spirit of God is provided by the Father and the Son to enable us to know God and discern God's will for us. The Spirit is as deserving of our praise, honor and glory as is the Father and the Son. Without this Spirit, we could not know the other members of the Godhead. The Spirit enables us to read and understand God's written and spoken Word as revealed to us in the Holy Scriptures.

I believe that God's revelation continues, but is historically recorded in the Holy Bible.
